Title: "Utilizing MMPI clinical scales as predicting variables for outcome measurement in a job readiness program."

Dissertation Proposal: To utilize a data set of approximately 300 protocols of minority homeless and drug rehabilitated individuals as part of an ongoing research project examining psychological assessment variables and program completion with individuals involved in a job-training program in Brooklyn, NY. Research will explore psychological variables related to pathology and the factors that impinge on the ability of these individuals to successfully navigate through this program and utilize therapeutic supports. Variables will include MMPI Depression, Anxiety, Hypomania and Psychopathic Deviate Scales, program completion, employment rates and a comprehensive list of demographic and descriptive variables.
